Professional Pitch

Opening Statement: Tell your prospective employer who you are, and what you are hoping to accomplish. Example:

• My name is Joe Smith and I am a recent graduate of _____ (program) and am looking for career opportunities in a community oriented organization.

Follow Up Statement: The most important thing you want the employer to know. This thought should separate you from all the other candidates.

Example:

• I graduated at the top of my class and have on the job experience from my Co-Op placement.

Statement of Accomplishment: One thing you did well and can give an example of. Avoid too much detail. Example:

• My experience includes safety planning and scheduling. I wrote a work safety plan for my final report, and received top marks
